

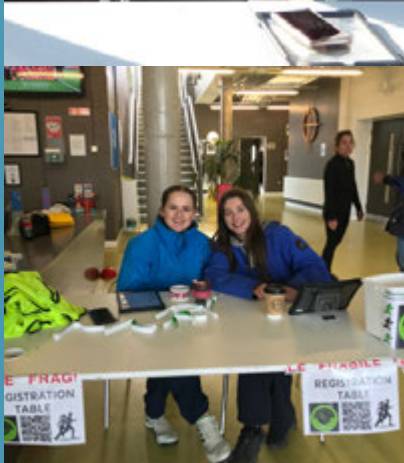

For every €400 raised by our parents on Saturday 2nd March, one student can now be educated for an entire year in the Loreto boarding school established by Sr Orla Treacy in Rumbek. We are delighted to announce that all of the running and walking was well worth it as our parents and students raised over €25,000 for our sister school. That means that over 60 students can now be educated for a year in South Sudan. 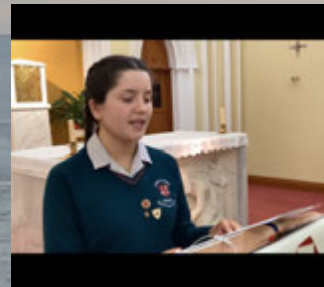
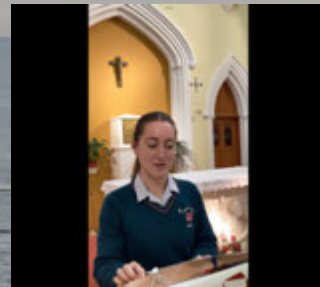
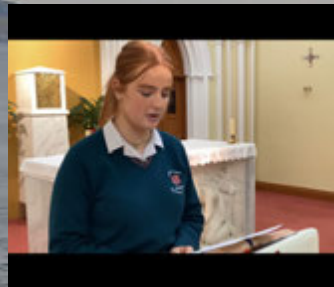
