


1 A Message from the Principal




O2 Attendance Strategy

As part of our School Self Evaluation process, we examine areas of school life that require a special focus. In line with the National Strategy for School Attendance promoted by Tusla, we analysed our students' attendance and punctuality in Term 1, putting in place a number of measures to support students and parents going into Term 2.

While there has been a marked improvement in full and partial day absenteeism, punctuality, as noted by parents in the SSE survey we carried out, continues to be a concern. Therefore, we have amended 7.2 of our Code of Behaviour to state that 'If a student is late twice in one week, detention will be imposed'.

In addition, we have also amended 7.14 of the Code of Behaviour in line with our reviewed Mobile Phone Policy. While some schools attempt to operate a mobile phone free campus, the nature of our student cohort is such that commuting is a daily occurrence for many and so our students' safe journey to and from school is a priority.

However, of late, we have had an increasing number of incidents involving students accessing mobile phones and associated apps such as TikTok, Snapchat and Instagram during school hours. Therefore, students found to be in breach of our Mobile Phone Policy will have their 'phone confiscated for 24 hours and parents will be informed. Should a parent state that their daughter requires her phone for her journey home, the student will then have to return the phone to the office the following morning in order to complete the designated period of confiscation. Students will also have to sit an on the spot lunch time detention on the day of confiscation or at the next opportunity. It will be returned at 16.30 that day and a note will be made in the student's Journal. For second and subsequent offences, parents/guardians will be required to collect the mobile phone from the office.' We are hopeful that these measures will create a distraction free environment where teaching and learning will flourish.

04 School Fees

The Board of Management has responsibility for the financial stewardship of the school and has always endeavoured to keep our fee structure manageable for families while providing a wide range of subject options, smaller classes, an advantageous pupil-teacher ratio, significant academic supports and a wide range of co and extra-curricular activities.

Our annual increases are generally in the region of 5%, however, this year the increase has been limited to 3.8%. We invest any annual surplus in the development of facilities. We do not include any hidden charges for development funds etc. and to date have avoided calling on the generosity of parents for capital fundraising.

As one of 50 schools that historically decided to retain a fee charging status, we receive no capital funding from the State; 43 teaching salaries are financed by the Department of Education with the remainder funded at Department rates by the Board. All salaries for administrative, support and coaching staff are financed by school fees.

Forecast Expenditure 2023/24

The pie chart below illustrates the split of costs for 2023/24..

In the past year, the Board has undertaken the following work:

- The Physics and Biology labs have been upgraded.
- New floors were installed in nine classrooms.
- Areas of the Sports Hall were refloored.
- A new social area on the C Corridor was created.
- The CCTV cameras in the Sports Hall were upgraded.
- Areas of the Sports Hall, two corridors and seven classrooms were repainted.
- Preservation works were carried out to the external walls.

The following Summer works schedule will be carried out this year:

- The entire flat roof on the extension wing will be replaced.
- New classroom doors on two corridors will be installed.
- New flooring will be installed in eight classrooms.
- The external windows in the Concert Hall will be repainted.
- Upgrading of the LED lights in the Sports Hall.
- Upgrading of the Changing Rooms in the Sports Hall.
- Redecoration of the Lecture Theatre.







05 Payment of Fees
