


Points are calculated from one sitting of the LC **ONLY**

Access routes to college

• DARE:

alternative admissions scheme for school leavers whose disabilities have had a negative impact on their second level education. DARE offers reduced points places to school leavers who, as a result of having a disability, have experienced additional educational challenges in second level education.



• HEAR: is a college and university scheme that offers places on reduced points and extra college support to those who are resident in the Republic of Ireland and underrepresented at Higher Education due to their socioeconomic background.



SUSI: Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI)

Before applying for your grant, we would encourage you to review the eligibility criteria by selecting your student type based on whether you are <u>PLC</u>, <u>Undergraduate</u>, <u>Postgraduate</u> or <u>Studying Outside the State</u>.

You can also use our <u>Eligibility Reckoner</u> where you can quickly and easily self-assess whether you may be eligible for a grant.




Filling out the CAO

Change of Mind Procedure

Change of Mind - 7th May (12:00 noon) to 1st July (17:00)

At the beginning of May applicants will be able to register an online change of course choices, free of charge. If you change online an acknowledgement will be sent to the e-mail address you used at the application stage.

There is no fee for using the Change of Mind facility.

Making Changes:

- subject to the exceptions and restrictions mentioned below, you may change course choices (without fee) as often as you wish, up to 17:00 on the 1st July;
- if you submit a Change of Mind it cancels and supersedes all the previous course choices in any category in which changes are made. However, choices in the two categories (Level 8 and Level 7/6) are considered to be completely separate from each other for this purpose e.g. a change of Level 8 course choices will not affect Level 7/6 choices.
- if you do not wish to change the courses in one category, do not submit a change. Your original courses in that category will remain unchanged.
- do not mix courses from different categories (Level 8 and Level 7/6) and make sure to list all of your course choices for the particular category which you change.
- except for **Restricted Application Courses/Restricted Categories of applicant** (see below), you may enter on the form courses which did not appear on your original application.

This is why order of preference is so important




Deferral & Round 2/3 offers


You need to contact the HEI- deferrals are not always granted. Follow the procedure on the CAO website.


You may receive a round 2 or round 3 offer for a higher preference course.
